Introduction

Identified solutions at survey

1500mm wide with a fully balustraded anti climb handrail system with no passing point larger than 100mm. Logistical considerations to ensure correct equipment delivery.

Projected time on site and the identified challenges for the installation

Due to the central London location there were additional issues with deliveries to the installation site. Liaison with the Metropolitan police was required to organise time slots for deliveries and additional time was necessary to allow work around the Metropolitan police and Vinci Constructions' site policies.

Full site inductions were carried out by Vinci Construction upon arrival and the site was fully secured until signed off on the day of completion.

As this is a historic site, fixings could not be made to any of the stonework at ground level. All feet were placed on protective pads and a system of bracing was used rather than direct fixings, providing a strong, stable and secure ramp.

The projected installation time was 4 days, with a strict deadline for completion owing to the logistical challenges of the location.
